Orrell's Blog 3rd March 2024

It is very fitting we take 40 days (Lent) of preparation leading up to Good Friday and Resurrection Sunday.

Jesus' death and resurrection are at the pinnacle of our narrative - the story guides and gives form, shape, and direction to our lives. Easter is an 'alternative ending' to a story which 'appears' to be hopelessly and rapidly progressing towards a tragic ending. The empty tomb is the ultimate 'director's cut,' since it represents how God intends the story to end.



In very simple terms, this narrative can be summed up with three R's:

- Rescue The history of God's gift of Salvation is of God rescuing His
 people from bondage, first from the bondage of slavery in Egypt and
 eventually from the bondage of sin through the life, death, and resurrection
 of Jesus Christ.
- Restoration God continually restores us into a right relationship with Him and with one another.
- Reassurance God's saving grace continues to be present with us through the presence of the Holy Spirit and the Church, and in particular, the Sacraments.

Easter is a perfect time to remember, renew, and reaffirm our baptism. It is also an opportunity to repent (do a uey) and believe the good news. (Mark 1.15 NIV)

Through baptism, we embrace God's narrative as our own, replacing the unhealthy stories too often guiding our lives into disarray, unhappiness, and, in too many cases, ruin.

Baptism results in us joining a people in recovery.

Recovery from any form of addiction requires a healthy new narrative, lest the old plotline which caused the addiction in the first place re-asserts itself. The new narrative tells us we are born and live addicted to sin, but, through the death and resurrection of Jesus, we find a path to recovery and freedom - a new life, which is also known as Salvation.

At Easter, we celebrate our baptism, by which we are called back to this life-giving narrative reminding us of God's ongoing rescue, restoration, and reassurance.

So, this Easter we want to give you a personal invitation....

Good Friday Service 29th of March @ 8am

 Remember and affirm your baptism - come forward along with others to be anointed in the shape of the cross with oil on your forehead.



You can do this on Good Friday without any need of prior notice.

Resurrection Sunday 31st of March @ 9am

- 2. **Reaffirm your (infant) baptism**, by full emersion in water and public acknowledgment of Jesus as your Lord and Saviour.
- 3. **Repent and be baptised** by full emersion in water as a public acknowledgment of Jesus as your Lord and Saviour.



If you would like to either (2) reaffirm your baptism or (3) be baptised for the first time by full immersion in water, then please let us know prior to Resurrection Sunday.

"...'Repent and be baptised, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.

The promise is for you and your children and for all who are far off - for all whom the Lord our God will call.' With many other words he (Peter) warned them; and he pleaded with them, 'Save yourselves from this corrupt generation.'

Those who accepted his message were baptised, and about three thousand were added to their number that day." Acts 2.38-41. NIV.
