The story of two people walking together, deep in conversation, along the road to Emmaus finds strong echoes in our own behaviour in the face of grief, fear, and incomprehension.


Grief both paralyses and galvanises, you are unable to sit and do nothing, but you can't focus on anything

Job didn't understand why he had to suffer so much.


So, throughout the book of Job, we see him expressing heartache and anger at the pain and suffering God was obviously allowing.
