Theme: Staying Near The Tomb Bible Reading: John 20:1-18

Mary Magdalene came to the tomb. Finding the stone rolled away, she ran and told Peter and the other disciple, probably John, who came to investigate her claim that someone had taken the Lord's body out of the tomb. After agreeing with her claim, they simply returned home.

Mary on the other hand stayed at the tomb weeping. Because she stayed at the tomb, the resurrected Jesus revealed himself to her. This time she went to the disciples with a different story. "I have seen the Lord".

Theme

Mary Magdalene, unlike the other disciples, stayed at the tomb and was personally addressed by the Risen Christ. Sometimes we, like Mary, need simply to stay, to remain close to Jesus until we come to believe in Jesus, until we are given the full Easter faith that we desire. Christians are those who stay close to Jesus in order that the Risen Christ may come close to us.

Prayer (by Rev William Willimon)

Lord Jesus, we gather today loudly, lovingly, lavishly to celebrate your great defeat of death, your grand victory over the forces of sin. We give thanks that you loved us enough not only to die for us but also to rise for us and our salvation.

Enable us to lay aside our doubts, our misgivings, and understandings and bask in the light of your resurrected glory.

Sweep up your church in a great shout of glorious praise this day, this triumphant day that is your great gift to us and the world.

Help us to live so others may see your Easter victory in us. Amen

Jesus forgives even THAT

What is the one thing in your life that you regret more than anything? The one thing that you don't share with other people. The thing that if you could, you would go back and re-do or take back? Everyone has something like that. It's the thing that you have begged God to forgive you for, but you haven't quite been able to forgive yourself. There may even be times when you question if God has really forgiven you and you are tempted to go to him time and again just to make sure he knows you are sorry.

DOES JESUS REALLY FORGIVE EVEN THAT?

The day of Jesus' crucifixion and death was an extremely painful one for him - physically and emotionally. The religious leaders felt threatened. Jesus' teachings threatened their belief system, status, power and wealth. They hated Jesus so much, they would stop at nothing to see him dead, despite his innocence.

He was falsely accused, lied about, mocked, spat on, flogged, denied by a close friend, nailed to a cross for all to see. It is inconceivable to us that Jesus died for even those people. Our hearts cry out to God in unbelief and in sorrow for the way they treated our Lord. And yet ...

JESUS FORGIVES EVEN THAT

As Jesus hung on the cross, there were two others who hung beside him. Two men tried on the evidence and convicted of their crimes.

One chose to use his last moments to mock and insult Jesus.

The other, in his agony, recognised who Jesus was. It wasn't too late. His sins weren't too big. He cried out to Jesus and confessed the depth of his sin. He knew he was guilty and he also knew that Jesus was perfect and free from sin. He knew that Jesus was the only one who could forgive him.

Jesus, in his own unimaginable agony, shows grace and mercy for others.

The hard truth is that our sin is just as personal to Jesus as were those awful, untrue, accusations thrown at him. Our sins are as offensive and painful to him as the crown of thorns, the flogging, the mocking.

And not just our own sins which we recall with huge regret - there are also the ones we can't or don't name. The little white lies, the gossiping, the jealousy, the judgmental attitude. Sin is sin! It's all the same in Jesus' eyes. It's all personal, all offensive, all painful to our Lord. He suffered and died for all of it.

YES! JESUS CAN FORGIVE IT ALL!

"If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." 1 John 1:9
